Be Healthy-Be Smart-Be Holy

To address concerns regarding the Coronavirus, Bishop Talley along with Fr. Auggie have instituted the following changes to our Liturgy.

- Only the host will be shared at Communion.
- Minimize contact during the exchange of the Sign of Peace. (You may turn to your neighbor, bow and wish them Christ's peace verbally.)
- This weekend all activities for children and teens are cancelled. (including the nursery) Therefore, more children may be attending Mass. Let us welcome them, knowing that at times children are more active and vocal than other parishioners.

The most important way to minimize the spread of infectious diseases is for people who have symptoms such as fever, upset stomach, or frequent coughing or sneezing, to stay home and to seek medical attention as symptoms warrant. The Church does not bind us to attend Mass when sick, or when taking care of sick family members. If you cannot attend Mass, you can offer prayers at home to make the Sabbath holy.
