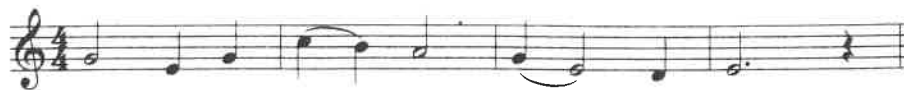
First Reading
