Isaiah 25:6-10 | Psalm 23 | Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20 | Matthew 22:1-14

From today’s reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah:
“The Lord will wipe away the tears from every face.”

Reflection by Br. Carlos Salas, OP:

Think of a thanksgiving feast. There is plenty of food for everyone, many flavors and textures, the laughter and company of loved ones, and a spirit of thankfulness to God and one another. That is a hint of the feast that our Lord and King has prepared in heaven. To partake in it, we also need to prepare ourselves. And if the Prophet Isaiah says that the Lord will wipe away our tears, then there *will* be tears, and the preparation will not be a breeze. Thus, like the Apostle Paul, we need to learn and be able to live in all situations: in humble circumstances and in abundance. We must remain confident that the Lord guides us in right paths, remaining in the hope of dwelling in the feast in the house of the Lord forever.

Something to think about:

- * For many of us, it doesn’t appear like the Lord is guiding us along restful waters. How does the grace of the Sacraments keep me rooted in the faith in times of trial?
- * Hope for Christians is not wishful thinking or relying on our efforts. Instead, it is the confidence that by placing our trust in Christ and His promises, He will remain faithful to us (2 Tim 2:11-13. What do I need to turn over to Him?

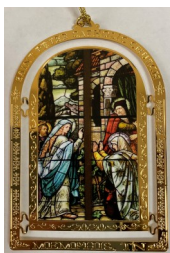

Liturgical Music Notes for Ordinary XXVIII

Since Old Testament times, the Psalms have inspired sung prayer: Hebrew cantillation by a Cantor in the Temple, monastic chant in medieval Latin, and rising in the 16th c., vernacular translations set to simple melodies adapted for a lay congregation. This Sunday our worship begins and ends with verses drawn from the Psalms and sung to a tune named for its centuries-old association with Psalm 100 – thus *Old 100th*. And the Prelude will remind us of the shape of this melody; a frequent use of organ compositions since the early Baroque era.

Parents of 1st Graders and 7th Graders

The Diocese of Memphis requires two years of preparation for First Communion and Confirmation. Usually this happens in 1st and 2nd grades, and then in 7th and 8th grades. If your child is in 1st grade or 7th grade, he/she needs to participate in faith formation this year to prepare for First Communion or Confirmation next year. This "pre-sacrament" year can take place in Catholic school or in the parish.

What does this mean this fall?

- First graders who are not in Catholic school are registered for faith formation at St. Peter. They will have a few home activities each month. For example, in September we are focusing on prayer. Children will set up a home prayer table and make prayer cards. They are also encouraged to attend the monthly Family Masses and participate in Children's Liturgy of the Word (Zoom).
- Seventh graders not in Catholic school are registered for faith formation at St. Peter. They will participate in the Sunday sessions with our youth minister Kaitlyn Pham and the youth team. These are combined for 7th and 8th graders and will meet via Zoom or Teams. They will also be encouraged to attend the monthly Family Masses.

We recognize that this is a difficult year and want to work with everyone to make sure children are on track for their sacraments. We are happy to help with a plan for your family. Public Mass Notes

- For Communion, **stay in your pew**. A priest will bring the host to you. Receiving Communion **is the only time** anyone is permitted to remove masks. Let's practice the 3 Rs: 1) Remove, 2) Receive, 3) Replace.
- **Ushers will go to each pew and direct you to leave** – from the back of the church to the front.
- Please do not linger in front of the church. The priests will not be interacting with people on the front steps.
