Exodus 22:20-26 | Psalm 18 | 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10 | Matthew 22:34-40

From today’s Gospel reading:

“You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”

Reflection by Br. Carlos Salas, OP:

Someone I know says that when a person is begging for money at a stoplight, she will roll down her window, give that person some money, and then she asks of them, “When you get to heaven, please pray for the nice lady in the Mercedes.” Our Lord is a God who listens to our prayers, especially the prayers of the poor. The reading from the Book of Exodus is unambiguous about how we must behave toward others. Worldly possessions and attachments make it more difficult for us to pray. Thus, we need to be generous with others with what we have—goods, talents, prayer, and accompaniment—giving special preference to the poor and those in most need among us. St. Martin de Porres didn’t have much in goods himself, but he gave from what he had even when it was technically breaking his superiors’ orders. He shared his gift of healing for the benefit of anyone without distinction. Out of love of Him, St. Martin was following his Lord’s command to love his neighbor.

Something to think about:

- What are the things or attachments in my life that distract me from the two greatest commandments?
- St. Martin de Porres showed humility before God and before those whom he encountered. Humility is the virtue that opposes the vice of pride, the source of every sin. Consider asking for St. Martin’s intercession for the virtue of humility; consider praying the Litany of Humility.

Liturgical Music Notes

St. Martin's Triduum / ORDINARY XXX

Soon after the Shrine of St. Martin de Porres found a home here at St. Peter's, a hymn about this saint was sought for use on his feast day and other occasions. Benedictine Sister Delores Dufner, recognized hymn-writer, was commissioned to compose a text reflective of Martin's life and holiness. She focused on "his charity and service towards all who were in need, and a prayer that we may recognize each person's dignity and act accordingly, so that justice may lead to peace in our world." She found inspiration in the book *Martin de Porres: A Saint for Our Time* by Joan Monahan. The sturdy early American tune *Morning Song* was chosen to pair with her words "For Martin, Father of the Poor". Today's organ Prelude is based on that melody.

Introduction to Iconography

Thursday, November 12th at 7-8 PM

Sr. Rebecca, a nun of New Skete monastery in Cambridge, New York, (<https://newsketete.org>) will provide a one-hour presentation on painted iconography in the Byzantine and Russian traditions. Painted icons are a central part of the catholic tradition as exemplified in Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Coptic, and other eastern Christian Churches.

Sr. Rebecca began her studies in iconography at the Russian Institute of Paris in 1976 with Fr. Egon Sendler, S.J., a world famous expert in the history of icons and in the technical aspects of icon production. In addition to teaching iconography and painting icons, Sr. Rebecca uses iconography in lectures and retreats presented in the USA and abroad.
