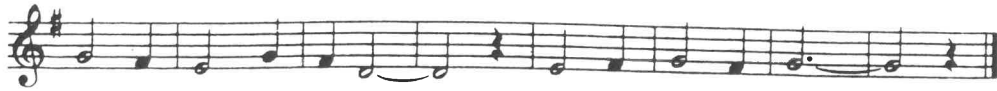


First Reading

Matthew 25:14-30
